The Tamil Community's fervent prayer for deliverance in their darkest hour

The spirit of the Tamils is oft conjoined in prayer to God to ward off evil and to thank him for his blessings. Spirituality is a part of our culture and tradition and one might even say is programmed into our DNA. Whether Hindu or Christian, the Tamil is imbued with this spiritual act of communing with his Creator and Benefactor as witnessed by the devotion expressed in mass pilgrimages in Tamil Nadu and Tamil Eelam to the shrines of our God and saints.

The Egyptians pursued them and went after them into the sea with all their horses, chariots, and drivers. Just before dawn the LORD looked down from the pillar of fire and cloud at the Egyptian army and threw them into a panic. He made the wheels of their chariots get stuck, so that they moved with great difficulty. The Egyptians said, "The LORD is fighting for the Israelites against us. Let's get out of here!"

The Bhagavad Gita too, describes failure to fight for religion as a sin. Buddhism in its pristine form is a philosophy of life that abnegates the existence of a God. It considers the natural laws of causation sufficient to explain the effects of karma. Buddhists make a virtue of the atheism in their dogma. Yet, their pilgrimages are to Hindu shrines and their confused prayer is to the Hindu Gods who their so-called religion denies that they exist. Like in most things in their life, they want to have the cake and eat it as well. They call the Tamils their citizens and bomb them as if they were not.

Whether their prayers ultimately reach a God they deny is a moot point as they would be praying for the evil of their repugnant racial superiority. God can and will not allow for such moral depredation.
