## URGENT ACTION REQUIRED: PLEASE CALL YOUR KIN AND KITH IN SRI LANKA TODAY!

As you will be aware, the Sri Lankan presidential election is scheduled for Tuesday, 26<sup>th</sup> January 2010 and it is a crucial juncture for our loved ones in the North and East of Sri Lanka to vote to try and free themselves from oppression and regain some dignity.

In an article in the New York Times recently, Lord Chris Patten - former governor of Hong Kong - argued "Now, put yourself in a Tamil's shoes, and decide whom to vote for in the presidential election: Choose either the head of the government that ordered the attacks against you and your family, or the head of the army that carried it all out." < More>

The current government interned over 300,000 Tamils for over six months in a most degrading condition, and that was after they had escaped the relentless bombing with no access from the outside world. Neither the UN nor the International community were able to free them from the clutches of the heartless Sri Lankan government. The current release of most interned Tamils must, in part, be credited to General Sarath Fonseka, as only after his expressly stated comments about Tamil suffering in his resignation letter and election manifesto forced the government to release them.

It is hoped that the change will come on January 26<sup>th</sup> and the Sinhalese will respect the need for Tamil rights in the North and East in order to put the brutal past behind. Without letting the Tamils in the North and East to control their own lives in an autonomous region, Sri Lanka will never be at peace or achieve sustained prosperity.
